### **United States**

**68,760** CWS Blankets were recently distributed by local CWS partners to neighbors needing warmth and comfort.



With help from CWS, **70** families are working to rebuild homes that Hurricanes Eta and lota destroyed.



Haiti In recent months, CWS has helped **110** families build homes that are resistant to earthquakes and hurricanes.

#### Moldova

After Russia launched its invasion of Ukraine, CWS helped purchase a forklift for our Moldovan partner Diaconia to use in its food bank. This food bank is serving as a logistics and material hub for a number of organizations supporting Ukrainian refugees.



# Kenya

During prolonged, severe drought, CWS provided 768 tons of food that **15,000** people are eating while they get back on their feet.

## **Thailand**

CWS helped remodel and expand the Kwai River Christian Hospital, which serves a community of **150,000** people. Many of the hospital's visitors are refugees from Myanmar.

### **Vietnam**

Through a CWS program, families now have sanitary toilets to use after recently building or repairing 140 latrines.
